May I take this opportunity to introduce myself as the new Chairman of your Parish Council. My name is Simon Kinder, and my wife and I settled in the area some 5 years ago when I retired from the Armed Forces.

It is an honour to be selected as Chairman of the Parish Council, I'm sure you will all join me in thanking Frank Myers for all his hard work and diligence during the many years he has held the post.



**These are challenging times** and your Parish Council is working hard to keep abreast of the many changes to services being introduced by Herefordshire Council. As I write this, a preferred bidder has been selected for the new Highways contract starting in September and, in anticipation of the remedial work promised at the start of the contract, the Parish Council has taken the initiative to catalogue all the potholes and road defects that affect the roads within the Parish. This will enable use to present the new Contractor with a composite list of defects at the start of the contract, and keep track of progress on your behalf.

**In addition, the Parish Council has engaged with Herefordshire Council** over the planning policies now proposed in the draft local plan, the 'Core Strategy 2011-31'. These proposals will directly affect the look and nature of new development within Walford Parish, and it is vitally important that we not only protect your interests, but also that we clearly understand what the needs and wishes of the residents and businesses within the Parish are. To this end, the Parish Council's work on Neighbourhood Plan is vitally important as this will provide all residents within the Parish with the opportunity to shape planning policy. Our progress with the Neighbourhood Plan is described later in this Newsletter, and I urge you to not only read about what is going on but also to get involved.

**Finally, have a very good summer.** We live in a beautiful part of the world and there can be few places where better to enjoy the whimsy of the British weather.

## Parish Projects

**There are no significant updates to report on any Parish Projects, other than the Kerne Bridge Canoe Launch Site:**

“Herefordshire Council are considering alternative ways of delivering the Countryside Service which will almost inevitably mean a more business focused approach to managing the various assets. Kerne Bridge does represent a potential financial opportunity and the Cabinet Member for Major Contracts and the Director for Places and Communities are of the view that we should retain Kerne Bridge Picnic site within the Countryside Service portfolio until such time as we have clarification as to how the service will be delivered in the future.”

Recently I was delighted to attend the opening of the new Robert Pashley wing at Walford School – built in partnership between the School and Herefordshire Council. The ceremony was presided over by Lady Darnley, Lord-Lieutenant of Herefordshire and showed how lucky the people of Walford are to have such a wonderful school under the headship of Miss George.

The progress being made on the Walford Parish Neighbourhood Plan is impressive and needs your support and input, so please get involved.

County wide much has been happening; due to massive cuts in our funding by Central Government we are having to look at new ways of doing things. This means we need to look at how we run Libraries, not closing them, but making sure we all help by volunteering and making sure the opening times are regulated. We need everyone in the county at this time to work together to help us run services as best we can.

## \*\* Vacancy on Walford Parish Council \*\*

**A vacancy has arisen in the Office of Parish Councillor on Walford Parish Council.**

**The vacancy can be filled in either of the following ways:**

- **Any Parishioner who is interested in becoming a Parish Councillor may be lawfully co-opted onto the Parish Council, without the need for a formal election.** The vacancy can be filled in this way, in accordance with the Local Elections (Parishes & Communities) Rules 1986. This would be done by interested parties attending a Parish Council meeting, at which they would give a presentation on why they wish to become a Councillor. If there is more than one candidate, the Parish Council take a democratic vote, the outcome of which would determine the successful candidate.
- **It is the democratic right of the Electorate to request an Election** and if 10 or more Parishioners write to Herefordshire Council, calling for an Election by 23rd July, the Electoral Services Office will inform the Parish Council. If more than one candidate is standing, an Election will be held. The Election would take place no later than Wednesday 25th September, taking the form of a proper Election, with canvassing, polling station, ballot papers and returning officer. **NB:** This option is likely to cost the Parish Council (and by default the Parishioners) in the region of £2,000.
- **If an Election is not requested**, any interested parties will be able to make their representations to the Parish Council at their meeting on 11th September, for consideration, to be co-opted onto the Council and the successful candidate will continue to serve as a co-opted member until the next 4 yearly Election is held.

**National Grid would like to thank local people** for their continued patience while it works to improve the national electricity network running through the area. The work being carried out will ensure that this part of the network continues to function effectively for decades to come. **The work remains on schedule** and we will have completed installing the new cable by the end of this year.

**We will start our reinstatement programme in July 2013** in areas along the route where our work is complete. The work will result in us returning the environment to the condition it was in before we started the project and will involve us filling in the areas where we've been excavating and carrying out a comprehensive replanting programme.

## Neighbourhood Development Plan

**Since April 2012, local communities are able to lead in the future planning of their area through the preparation of Neighbourhood Development Plans.** Whereas Herefordshire Council has led plan making in the past, Neighbourhood Development Plans will carry legal weight and be adopted provided they receive at least a 50% yes vote in a public referendum.

**Walford Parish Council elected to produce a Neighbourhood Plan in late 2012.** Although the Parish Council Neighbourhood Planning Committee are doing a large part of the preparatory work, the plan has to be owned by the Parish community and be a reflection of their aims and aspirations. To this end, The Parish Council will be arranging various public events and sending out a questionnaire later this year in order to prepare the Walford Neighbourhood Plan. It will then be submitted to Herefordshire Council where it will be checked for legal compliance, independently checked and then submitted to the Parish for referendum.

**The Parish Council have recently commented on Herefordshire Council's latest plan,** the draft Core Strategy 2011 – 2031, as there were some issues that we felt were prejudicial to future planning in the Parish. We understand that a revised document will be produced towards the end of June that hopefully will be more flexible.

**In the meantime the Neighbourhood Planning Committee have been taking steps to move the Parish's project forward.** By the time you read this we will have held a further Committee meeting, to which the public are invited, in which proposals for taking the work forward and a project plan will have been discussed and hopefully agreed, to be approved by the Parish Council, at their next meeting. In particular, we are currently preparing the questionnaire aimed at understanding your needs and wishes over a range of planning options, which we propose to distribute in October. **YOUR RESPONSE TO THE QUESTIONNAIRE IS VITALLY IMPORTANT** as work elsewhere on Neighbourhood Plans has already shown that if there is sufficient weight of local opinion, the Neighbourhood Plan can take precedence in setting planning policy.

**This is your opportunity to shape how Walford will develop. PLEASE GET INVOLVED**

## **URGENT: WE NEED YOUR HELP – Please contact us!**

**Walford Parish Council are part of the P3 Partnership Scheme**, which entails receiving a yearly grant from Herefordshire Council, to maintain our large network of Rights of Way within the Parish.

**One of the conditions of the agreement** is that the Parish Council guarantee to walk / inspect the 26km of footpaths twice a year.



It is proving impossible for our very dedicated Rights of Way Officer (who works full time) to carry out this task alone and this is currently holding up the grant award for 2013-14.

**We know that many of you enjoy your local footpaths**, walking your dogs, or just yourselves and are appealing for parishioners who wish to help keep the network of footpaths in good order, to come forward and volunteer to walk / inspect paths in their area, to help us meet the grant criteria. **Please let us know if you can help, ASAP.**

Last year it was Eric Drummond’s Homme Farm and this year we were invited to John Chinn’s Cobrey Farm.

**Cobrey Farm is reputed to be the largest Asparagus supplier in the UK** with millions of the tasty green shoots being supplied to all the big name supermarkets as well as wholesalers and the catering trade.

**But that’s not all**, visitors were shown interesting varieties of rhubarb and a vast crop of blueberries which would ripen later this summer (whenever that arrives).



Visitors to Cobrey Farm in June were viewing life in high season, where the sheer scale of the set up was outstanding.

The work force involved in picking, then packaging the produce to strict procedure to ensure freshness, was huge. Being stared at by a large gathering of visitors did not disturb the workforce one bit. They had work to do and that was that!
